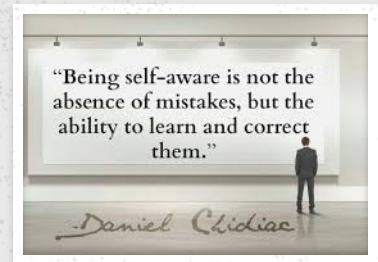


AWARE

a·ware ('wer) adjective 1. knowing something; having knowledge of something from having observed it or been told about it We are already aware of the problem, and we are dealing with it. 2. noticing or realizing something: knowing that something exists because you notice it or realize that it is happening. He became aware of a pain in his left side. 3. knowledgeable: well-informed about what is going on in the world or about the latest developments in a sphere of activity More financially aware investors were starting to sell their stock.
