#### Types of Colleges:



- 2-Year Colleges: Community College: Certificates (Career Technical Education), Associate's Degrees and Transfer Programs
- 4-Year Colleges: Undergraduate Education: Bachelor's Degrees
- Universities: a group of colleges together consisting of both Undergraduate and Graduate programs: Bachelor's Degrees, Master's Degrees, Doctoral and Professional Degrees


#### Important thoughts:

 The name of the school does not matter, what matters is how you will fit at the school

# 2- Year Colleges (Community College)

Students often choose to attend this school for various reasons:

- Vocational Training and Certification
  - Program lengths vary
- Earn an Associate's Degree (A.A. or A.S.)
  - Some students move on to work
  - Some students transfer after earning their A.A. or A.S. degree
- Transfer to a 4-year University
  - Many 4-year Universities have guaranteed transfer programs
  - UC/CSU schools give transfer admission priority to Community College transfers over transfers from other colleges/universities
  - Prescribed course of study to be eligible to transfer
  - Ideal time frame is 2 years at Community College and 2 years at 4-year College/University
    - Not a race, everyone has a different timetable

- Public vs. Private Schools









  - ACT w/writing: \$67 (fee waivers available)

# Applying to College

# **Steps to complete:**

- 1. Create list of colleges you want to go to
- 2. Determine application budget
- 3. Finalize list of colleges to apply to
- 4. Develop Timeline for completing applications
- 5. Complete/Submit Applications
- 6. Complete/Submit FAFSA/Dream Act

# **Colleges I'm Thinking About:**

These are colleges you have an interest in and would attend if admitted. There is no minimum or maximum for this list, but it should contain the following:

#### 2---- **SAFETY** Schools

a college that you will almost certainly get into because your standardized test scores, class rank and high school grades are well above the average for admitted students. Also, safety schools will always have relatively high acceptance rates.

#### 2---- MATCH Schools

a college that is likely to admit you because your grades, standardized test scores, and holistic measures are similar to those of typical students at the school.

#### 1---- **REACH** School

A college where your academic credentials fall below the school's range for the average freshman. Reach schools are long-shots, but they should still be possible. If you have a 2.0 GPA, Harvard is not a reach school — it's a dream."

# **Application Budget:**

It costs MONEY to apply to college.

Fee Waivers are available, but not guaranteed.

Figure out HOW MUCH you can spend on applications IF you do not get ANY fee waivers.

- Private Universities (\$0-\$90/app -- Fee Waivers Available)
  - Applications are due at different times
  - Admission requirements vary
- Community Colleges (Free Application)
  - Apply in December/January to get Priority Registration
  - o Take assessments in order to register for classes



California State University

- Applications
  - Open: October 1st
  - Deadline: November 30th @ 11:59pm
  - Apply @ www.calstate.edu/apply
- Minimum GPA is 2.0
- SAT / ACT exam
- Meet A-G requirements



# University of California

- Applications
  - Open August 1st
  - Submit on November 1st-30th @ 11:59pm
  - http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/
- The minimum required GPA is 3.0
- ACT w/writing or the SAT w/writing
- Meet A-G requirements
- 4 essay prompts-- 350 words each (8 essay prompt options)

- Applications
  - Opens- August 1st
  - Deadline- Varies (November-January)
  - http://www.commonapp.org/
- GPA requirement varies
- SAT/ACT w/writing
- Many use the Common App
- Writing Prompt
- Letter of Recommendation(s)
- Interview
- Use Naviance to send docs, i.e. transcripts, letters of recommendation, school report and other docs







# Applications due March 2nd

## 1 GRANTS

- Free Money for educational expenses based on financial need
- Main Types:
  - · Cal-Grant
  - Pell Grant



## 2 WORKSTUDY

- Jobs to help pay for school
  - Employment at the Campus
  - Up to 15 hours per week



## 3 LOANS

- Money on loan which must be paid back with interest
  - <u>Subsidized:</u> Government pays down interest while in school
  - Unsubsidized: Automatic monthly payments

## 4 SCHOLARSHIPS

- Free money based on specific requirements or criteria
- Main Types:
  - 1. On Campus
  - 2. National
  - 3. Local (High School)



# Why we keep it 100?

- Do NOT Auto-disqualify yourself
- \$2.9 Billion went unused in 2013-14 school year
  - Nearly \$400 million just in California
- You MUST apply every year

# College Decision - May 2020



- May 1st
  - Most universities (UCs, CSUs and privates) will ask that you make your decision by May 1st 2018
  - o Intent to Register/Enroll Deposit (Deferment available)
- Private Universities
  - Early Decision: decision plans are binding a student who is accepted as an ED applicant must attend the college
  - **Early Action:** plans are nonbinding students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1.
  - o Approximately 450 colleges have early decision or early action plans, and some have both
