- 1. Log into your **PARENT PORTAL** account to access the Online Registration. Please update, verify and **submit** your student data for each student. <u>Once you have submitted the Online Registration and it is processed by our staff, you will receive an email with a link to AppointmentQuest.</u>
- Schedule a Summer Conference appointment on the AppointmentQuest website. Use your students information as described below to log in to AppointmentQuest.

- 3. When scheduling siblings conferences, please schedule each conference at least **30 minutes** apart.



Tons of Practice AP Exams - AP exams are a few weeks away. But did you know that the College Board publishes practice exams for DAYS? Practicing with old exams is a GREAT way to get closer to scoring that 4 or 5. And, lucky for us, the CB publishes tons of Free Response Questions from previous years. To access them, click here, then click on the exam you're taking, then click on the Exam Practice tab on the top right. Choose an exam year, and get to it. (Keep in mind a couple of the exams have changed slightly over the years, like AP US History.) Another bonus: The College Board also publish tons of awesome sample answers to the Free Response Questions that scored super well. Study those.

How to Create a Great College List - With acceptance rates dropping every year to record lows, it's super important to have a balanced college list. Why? Every single year I hear from students who didn't get admitted to their "target" schools and yes, even what they called their "safety" schools (I'm thinking of the UCs this year). Here's my guide on how to figure out what you're looking for and ultimately make

sure you have a balanced college list, plus a handy-dandy spreadsheet with tips on where to research and how to track everything.

How to Get a Great Letter of Recommendation from Teachers - If you're a junior, the end of the year (after APs and finals) is a great time to give your teacher a heads up that you'd like to ask them for a recommendation when application time comes around next fall.
