While the celebration was cancelled due to Covid-19 - we would still like to commend them for their hard work!



New Information for Free and Reduced Lunch Families

Pandemic EBT Benefits (P-EBT) May 2020

Because schools are closed due to COVID-19, children who are eligible for free and reduced-price meals can receive up to \$365 in food benefits in addition to their pick-up meals from school.



How will Families get their P-EBT benefits?

Most families with children who applied for CalFresh or Medi-Cal do not need to apply. They will receive their P-EBT card in the mail beginning approximately May 7, 2020 through May 22, 2020.

Families with children who are eligible for free and reduced priced meals and who do not receive their P-EBT card in the mail by mail by May 22, 2020 **must apply online before June 30, 2020** at <https://www.cdss.ca.gov/home/pandemic-ebt>

***Students may still pick up to go meals even if they have P-EBT Benefits.**

Use it like a debit Card.

Families will get their P-EBT card to use on food and groceries. If you already have this card, you do not need to apply online.

HUMAN TRAFFICKERS MAY TARGET YOUR CHILD THROUGH TECHNOLOGY

KEEPING YOUR CHILDREN SAFE DURING COVID-19

DID YOU KNOW?

- As our world becomes more dependent on technology and the web, children are increasingly at risk of befriending strangers online.
- Traffickers use social media and gaming apps to connect and recruit youth.
- The most common way victims are trafficked in San Diego County is online.

SAN DIEGO COUNTY STATS

- The underground sex economy in the County is estimated at \$810 million a year.
- Over 3,500 victims are trafficked every year.
- 80% of those victims were born in the U.S.
- 90% of high schools studied had documented cases of human trafficking.
- Victims and traffickers can be any race, age, or gender.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR CHILD TO KEEP THEM SAFE ONLINE

- Is your account private?
- Are you sharing your:
 - First and Last names?
 - School name?
 - Status updates?
 - Locations tagged?
 - Contact info?
- Do you personally know the people you add as friends?

POTENTIAL SIGNS THAT YOUR CHILD MAY NOT BE SAFE ONLINE

- Becoming increasingly secretive
- Hiding what is on their computer screen
- Out of sight or behind a closed door when online
- Not speaking openly about their activity online
- Vague talk of making new friends with little to no details
- Agitated behavior when answering their phone
- Needing to take calls in private

FBI RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- Review and approve games and apps before they are downloaded.
- Make sure privacy settings are set to the strictest level possible for online gaming systems, phones and other devices.
- Monitor your child's use of the internet and keep computers in a non-private room.
- Explain to your child that images posted online most likely will remain on the internet permanently.
- Teach your child about personal boundaries and awareness of their surroundings.
- Encourage open child-parent communication around internet safety.
