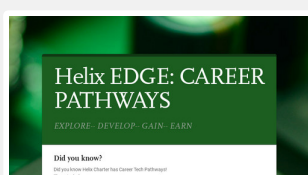


Helix EDGE

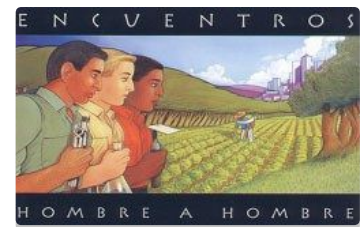

Athena Racing

[Athena Racing](#) is a new nonprofit in San Diego dedicated to helping young women enter careers in the STEM fields through motorsports. To put it another way, Athena Racing is the first all-female racing team in San Diego, and they are currently accepting applications for the 2019-20 team!



The 10 team members accepted will receive training in advanced driving, safety, and racing theory along with race car construction and engineering. They will undergo intensive media training, conduct on-camera interviews with both local and national media outlets, and will be booked for public speaking engagements making them confident spokespersons for the Athena brand. The value of team membership is \$50,000 per student, and Athena Racing will cover all expenses for accepted students.

Important Parking Lot Information

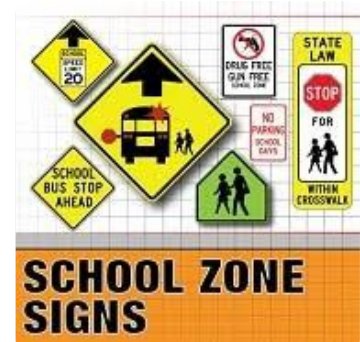
IMPORTANT!

This sign ↗ was recently posted at the entrance to the Helix student parking lot. The La Mesa Police Department can (and will) ticket drivers who do not follow the rules of the road in the parking lot.

Do not park along the red and yellow curbs. △ Yellow curbs are for ACTIVE loading and unloading (not sitting in your vehicle and waiting for your student). Red curbs are fire lanes and no parking zones.

Also, do not make U-turns in the middle of the driving lanes.
