- SOPHOMORE INTERVIEW - SCHOOLWIDE LEARNER OUTCOMES (SLO's)

- LESSON OBJECTIVES: We will spend the next two weeks reviewing the Helix SLOs. Students will learn about the individual outcomes and brainstorm different ways they have been working on developing the SLOs at Helix.
- STEP 1: Have student make a copy of the "[SLO Worksheet](https://bit.do/sloworksheet)" go to: bit.do/sloworksheet
- STEP 2: Change the title of the Google Doc to "SLO: Last Name, First Initial (ID#)"
 - Example: SLO: Dawg, S (1234)
- STEP 3: Save/Organize the SLO Worksheet into your Google Drive "2022 Portfolio" folder
- STEP 4: Begin reviewing the SLO's using the [SLO Google Slide](#).
 - Review each slide, showing the videos of Kevin and each GLP.
 - This week we encourage you to review the first three SLOs:
 - Constructive Thinkers
 - Effective Communicators
 - Informed Decision Makers
 - Have students work in pairs to come up with examples of where the outcomes are being developed in classes and activities. Provide examples of things that happen in your classes
