## Review Quizzes ("RQs").

- Test corrections for one retake attempt with teacher
- Highest Score kept


## Cumulative Exams (Paper \& Digital).

- FAIL $(<70 \%)$ = test corrections to RETAKE test
- PASS $(70 \%)=$ test revisions for $5 \%$ score increase
- Max retake score 80\%
- Max revise score $100 \%$


## Performance Tasks (group tests) $\rightarrow$ NO revisions or retakes

Retakes will only be available during a scheduled tutorial announced the day the tests are returned, you must do test corrections in order to retake.

## Retake Policy For Chapter Tests:

Students may retake the test during a scheduled tutorial for up to $100 \%$ if their homework grade for that chapter is above $\mathbf{8 0 \%}$ and retake for up to $\mathbf{7 0 \%}$ if their homework grade is below $80 \%$. The retake score replaces the original score no matter what so make sure that your student is prepared for the retake.

## PERFECT ATTENDAOCE CHALLENGE

Did you know that children can suffer academically if they miss 10 percent of the school year? That's just 18 days or 2 to 3 days a month. And that can add up before you know it. This October, Helix Charter High School is participating in the National Attendance Challenge, with a renewed push to get all kids to school-on time, every day.

Research shows us that absences add up. That's as true for kindergartners as it is for 12th graders. It's as true for excused absences as it is for skipping school. We know there will be
 days when your child will miss school, especially when they're sick. But we know that nationwide, as many as 7.5 million students miss 10 percent of the school year? That's 135 million days of missed school - and missed opportunities. And research shows us it also marks the point when students start to fall behind academically because they have missed too many days.
