

In order to receive Free/Reduced Meal services this year, you will need to submit a new meal application for 2020-2021. If you have not done so already, please submit your application as soon as possible. The quickest way to submit your application is to apply online. FIRE must receive all entries by 11:59 EST, December 31, 2020. Winners will be announced by February 15, 2021.



THE COOLIDGE

A SCHOLARSHIP FOR AMERICA

The Coolidge Scholarship is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that may be used by recipients for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States. Any high school junior who plans to enroll in college in the fall of 2022 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (current high school seniors are *not* eligible to apply).

Coolidge Scholars are selected based primarily on academic excellence. Secondary criteria include: an interest in public policy, an appreciation for the values President Coolidge championed, as well as humility and service.

If selected, each Bovard Scholar will have one full year of support through the admissions cycle and spend three weeks on the USC campus, where they will receive:

This year, the summer intensive runs from July 11, 2021 through July 31, 2021.

Every single year I hear from students who didn't get admitted to their "target" schools and yes, even what they called their "safety" schools (I'm thinking of the UCs this year). 

The End of an Era: Coach Singer Announces his Retirement

After 50 years in the Helix basketball program as a player and coach, John Singer is retiring. He has spent the last 39 years at the helm of one of the most successful programs in the CIF San Diego Section. Under his leadership, his teams won 19 League Championships, four boys CIF Championships, and one girls CIF Championship.

John compiled 741 wins with his boys teams and another 200 coaching the girls. In 2017, his team won the CIF Championship, SoCal Regional, and was the State Runner-Up. He leaves as the second most winningest basketball coach in CIF San Diego Section history.

We thank John for his service to our student-athletes and wish him well in retirement.
