# COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAMS

#### Facts:

- Opportunity to earn college credits while in high school
- Tuition expenses are waived
- Gain confidence in ability to perform at a college level
- Grades are a part of a student's permanent collegiate record. (will be calculated in the college GPA)

#### Facts:

- Student is responsible for all aspects of communication, enrollment and grades.
  - No one else may speak on behalf of the student including: Parents/Guardians and high school personnel.
- There is no rush to take classes. Students should not be taking multiple classes to "get things done".

## Types of Programs @ Helix:

- Articulation
- Dual Enrollment
- Concurrent Enrollment

#### Articulation

- High School Course with an agreement through GCCCD for opportunity to earn college credit
  - To earn college credit, student must:
    - 1. Pass both semesters of high school course with a B grade or better.
    - 2. Turn in a completed "Student Petition for Articulated Credit" form to their instructor before the end of the course.
      - a. Student must have an active college application on file
      - b. Student must know their GCCCD ID

#### Dual Enrollment

- College Course taught on Helix campus under a <u>CCAP</u> agreement
  - To earn college credit, **student** must:
    - 1. Be enrolled in both high school and college course.
      - a. Must have active application at college
      - b. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student, parent/guardian and school official
      - c. Verify college enrollment in Webadvisor account
    - 2. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.

<sup>\*</sup>All expenses are covered for the student including tuition, fees, textbooks and materials

#### Concurrent Enrollment

- College Course taught at the college campus or online
  - To register for a class, student must:
    - 1. Be enrolled in the college course.
      - a. Must have approval of Grade Level Team
      - b. Must have active application at college
      - c. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student, parent/guardian and school official
      - d. Enrollment through Webadvisor account
    - 2. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.

<sup>\*</sup>Student is responsible for all costs except for tuition, including: fees, textbooks and materials

#### Concurrent Enrollment

- College Course taught at the college campus or online
  - To earn high school credit, student must:
    - 1. Have approval from their Grade Level Team prior to registration
    - 2. Enroll college course.
      - a. Must have active application at college
      - b. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student and parent/guardian
      - c. Enrollment in Webadvisor account
    - 3. Send copy of schedule to college center
    - 4. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.
    - 5. Send copy of final grades by term to college center before the start of the next semester.

- Students may start taking Articulation classes in the 9th grade.
- Students may start taking Dual Enrollment classes in the 10th grade
- Students may start taking Concurrent Enrollment classes upon successful completion of the 10th grade.

- Students may only take ONE class during the Summer Sessions.
- Students may take ONE class per term their first time taking Dual/Concurrent Enrollment.
  - Depending on success in college and high school courses, students may be allowed to take up to TWO courses per term in subsequent semesters

• Senior year some students may be granted permission to take up to 3 classes in a term depending on their previous college success and current high school schedule.

- Students must remain below the college Full-Time enrollment Status.
  - Fall/Spring: Full time enrollment is 12 college units,
     so high school students may not enroll in more than
     11.5.
  - Summer: Full time enrollment is 8 college units, so high school students may not enroll in more than
     7.5.
