WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A SENIOR PROJECT JUDGE?



It is with great pleasure I invite you to participate as a judge for Helix Charter High School's upcoming Senior Defenses and Senior Boards. All Helix seniors must complete the Senior Project, which entails creating a product, coordinating an event, planning a performance, or providing an actual service that has been designed by them.

The final phase of the Senior Project is "Senior Defenses" and "Senior Boards", which provide an opportunity for our students to shine and to feel a sense of accomplishment as they demonstrate their knowledge and skills to their community.

This year's Senior Defenses will take place from 12:00 - 3:30 pm on Wednesday, April 10; Thursday, April 11 and Friday, April 12. Defenses are the process in which students meet with a smaller panel of judges (usually 2-3 staff members and 1-2 community members) to show the steps they took to complete their project, prove that they did it, and answer questions about their project.

Senior Boards will take place on Tuesday, May 28, and Wednesday, May 29, from noon-4 pm. Boards are the process in which students must present to a larger panel (up to 10 people) and

do a formal presentation of their project and reflect on their high school experience.

The Senior Project is just one example of Helix's ongoing efforts to provide graduates with the tools necessary to succeed in their future endeavors, whether it is college, full-time employment, trade school, or the military.

We need many, many community members to participate in order to provide our students with good evaluations of their projects, and we appreciate your willingness to help. Please feel free to pass this information along to anyone you think would be interested in judging, or provide me with contact information and I will personally invite them.
