



# **Distance Only Learning - Spring 2021**

Weekly Schedule Change - Mon/Fri Switch

Increased Instructional Minutes - Synchronous classes are now 5 minutes longer

Advisory - Grade Level Teams will hold mandatory Zoom advisory on Fridays at 10:00 AM

**Late Policy** - We are eliminating the schoolwide Distance Learning one week grace period for submission of student work. Deadlines will return to department and course level team practices.

**Grading** - Grading policy will remain the same. Teachers will not assign Fs and students who do not pass a course will receive a NM.

#### In-person Academic Support

We will be expanding our In-person Academic Support program to run 3 days a week with small cohorts on Tuesday, Thursdays, and Fridays from 8:30am-10:30am.

Those interested in attending on-campus student support will need to sign up again via the interest form. This form will be distributed by both Mr. Watkins and the GLTs within the next week so keep an eye out for that.
