Facts:

- Opportunity to earn college credits while in high school

Facts:

- Student is responsible for all aspects of communication, enrollment and grades.
 - No one else may speak on behalf of the student including: Parents/Guardians and high school personnel.
- There is no rush to take classes. Students should not be taking multiple classes to "get things done".

Articulation

- High School Course with an agreement through GCCCD for opportunity to earn college credit
 - To earn college credit, student must:
 - 1. Pass both semesters of high school course with a B grade or better.
 - 2. Turn in a completed "Student Petition for Articulated Credit" form to their instructor before the end of the course.
 - a. Student must have an active college application on file
 - b. Student must know their GCCCD ID

Dual Enrollment

- College Course taught on Helix campus under a <u>CCAP</u> agreement
 - To earn college credit, **student** must:
 - 1. Be enrolled in both high school and college course.
 - a. Must have active application at college
 - b. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student, parent/guardian and school official
 - c. Verify college enrollment in Webadvisor account
 - 2. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.

^{*}All expenses are covered for the student including tuition, fees, textbooks and materials

Concurrent Enrollment

- College Course taught at the college campus or online
 - To register for a class, student must:
 - 1. Be enrolled in the college course.
 - a. Must have approval of Grade Level Team
 - b. Must have active application at college
 - c. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student, parent/guardian and school official
 - d. Enrollment through Webadvisor account
 - 2. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.

^{*}Student is responsible for all costs except for tuition, including: fees, textbooks and materials

Concurrent Enrollment

- College Course taught at the college campus or online
 - To earn high school credit, student must:
 - 1. Have approval from their Grade Level Team prior to registration
 - 2. Enroll college course.
 - a. Must have active application at college
 - b. Must have submitted a complete High School Authorization form signed by student and parent/guardian
 - c. Enrollment in Webadvisor account
 - 3. Send copy of schedule to college center
 - 4. Pass class based on instructors syllabus.
 - 5. Send copy of final grades by term to college center before the start of the next semester.

Enrollment Guidelines:

- Students must remain below the college Full-Time enrollment Status.
 - Fall/Spring: Full time enrollment is 12 college units,
 so high school students may not enroll in more than
 11.5.
 - Summer: Full time enrollment is 8 college units, so high school students may not enroll in more than
 7.5.

Enrollment Guidelines:

- Students should not take on more than the are willing to work for A grades in.
 - Consideration should be given to high school schedule, outside commitments and past academic performance.
- Students should focus on areas that interest them so they will have the best chance of success.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All courses on IGETC must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Grades of "C-" are not acceptable. Each course acceptable for IGETC must have a minimum 3 semester or 4 quarter unit value. Students wishing to use a course to meet an IGETC requirement must be sure that the course is on the IGETC list during the academic year when it is taken.

- *UC credit may be limited. (1) No credit given for an introductory course if taken <u>after</u> more advanced college course, (2) credit may be limited for courses with overlapping content, (3) duplicate credit will not be awarded for both the Honors and regular version of a course.
- **Courses taken at regionally accredited colleges or universities that are not part of the California Community College system can meet general education requirements for IGETC. Approval of IGETC placement is done by the Articulation Officer. M. Denise Aceves, via the "Pass Along" review process.
- Certification is a UC <u>admission</u> requirement and students must request certification from the Grossmont College Office of Admissions & Records.
- Area F is a new CSU Graduation Requirement that is NOT part of IGETC for 21-22. CSU bound students may complete prior to transfer.
