### **Importance of 11th Grade and Summer School**

- Pass ALL Your Classes- Finishing strong in 11th Grade
- Last chance to make impact on GPA
- Take SAT/ACT at least once in 11th grade (recommended)
- Attend Summer School:
  - If student failed any required courses (Summer School meetings in May)
  - If you want to take a Community College course
- Summer Registration
  - Course Request are locked in
  - Make Summer Enrollment appointments ASAP
  - You will meet with Mrs. Street, Mr. Gonzalez or Mrs. Singer
  - Schedule one-on-one meeting with Mrs. Trevino to discuss College Choices



### **NCAA Requirements**



#### For Division 1 or Division 2 Universities ONLY

- Earn 2.3 Overall GPA in Core Courses (English, Math, Science, History, Foreign Language)
  - No remediation in 12th grade
- Take SAT/ACT (refer to sliding scale on NCAA Eligibility Center)
- Create an NCAA Eligibility Center account (<u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>)
  - Send SAT/ACT test scores to NCAA (Code: 9999)
  - Upload high school transcript at the end of 11th grade and the end of 12th grade)
  - Complete Amateurism Survey
- Must complete this in order to play in the first year of college
- Division 3 and NAIA requirements are different

#### Students must:

- Apply online at <u>www.grossmont.edu</u>
- Placement exam: English or Math (\*if necessary)
- Complete a High School/College Credit Enrollment Authorization Form (HSCC Form)
  - o Forms can be picked up and dropped off with Mrs. Street, Mr. Gonzalez or Mrs. Singer
  - Forms must have all signatures (student and parent/guardian)
  - Include class you are interested in taking
  - Include what college you will be attending, i.e. Grossmont or Cuyamaca (for Summer and Concurrent Enrollment Only)
- Must pay for textbooks or required materials and parking
- Pay \$19 Health Fee -- That's ALL!

# **Community College Classes**

#### **Summer Classes**

- Assigned a Registration date/time
- Open registration: May 9th at 8am
- Student responsible for:
  - Books
  - Health Fees

#### **Concurrent Enrollment**

- Assigned a Registration date/time
- Classes being taught at either Grossmont or Cuyamaca
- Student responsible for:
  - Books
  - Health Fees

#### **Dual Enrollment**

- Classes being taught at Helix HS
- Helix pays for books
- Helix covers health fee



# Starting and ending 12th Grade Strong

- 12th Grade- No senioritis!
- Must pass ALL classes
- 12th Grade is the busiest year
  - Classes
  - Senior Project Completion
  - Senior Project Defense
  - Senior Boards
  - College Applications
  - College exams (SAT/ACT, placement tests)
  - FAFSA/CA Dream Act Applications
  - Senior Activities (Prom, Homecoming, Graduation, etc.
- Colleges look at final transcript and can rescind your application if a student:
  - Fails classes
  - Changes schedule after submitting application
  - Or perform lower than previous academic level

- Must be completed or students will NOT graduate from Helix

- Senior Boards- May 29th and 30th

### **SAT/ACT Exams**

SAT	June 3	August 26	October 7	November 4	*December 2
ACT	June 10	September 9	October 28	*December 9	

- Can meet HCHS Graduation Requirements
- Required for College Admission to a Four-Year University
- Register on time! Visit websites to see registration deadlines
- \*Most schools will take SAT/ACT test up to November (some allow \*December tests)
- Cost
  - SAT w/writing: \$57 (fee waivers available)
  - ACT w/writing: \$58.50 (fee waivers available)
  - o Contact Mrs. Street, Mr. Gonzalez or Mrs. Singer for Fee Waivers
- Test Prep Available
  - o SAT Prep @ HCHS: May 30th June 2nd (\$15)
  - o ACT Prep @ HCHS: June 5th June 9th (\$15)
  - College Board: Khan Academy (Free)
  - ACT Test Prep: ACT Website

- ASVAB- available two times a year
- Mock SAT or Mock ACT

# **College Applications**

### Get help every Wednesday at Club College w/Mrs. Singer and the GLT

- UCs (\$70/app -- Fee Waivers Available)
  - Applications open on August 1st
  - Due November 30th
- CSUs (\$55/app -- Fee Waivers Available)
  - Applications open on October 1st
  - o Due November 30th
- Private Universities (\$0-\$90/app -- Fee Waivers Available)
  - Applications are due at different times
  - Admission requirements vary
- Community Colleges (Free Application)
  - Apply in December/January to get Priority Registration
  - Take assessments in order to register for classes



# **Financial Aid Applications**

#### Class of 2018 Goal: 100% FAFSA/CA Dream Act Completion

- FAFSA (w/Social Security Number):
  - Create FSA ID during Summer Registration
  - Opens October 1st
  - Use 2016 Tax Return information
  - Due March 2nd
- CA Dream Act (w/out Social Security Number):
  - Opens October 1st
  - Use 2016 Tax Return information
  - Due March 2nd



#### FAFSA will help students if they are interested in attending:

Community College 4 Year Universities Vocational/Trade Schools Military

### Financial Aid/Scholarships

#### 11th Grade

- Research and apply to scholarships
- Save your 2016 tax return information.
   You will need them in October to fill out FAFSA/CA Dream Act Application

#### 12th Grade:

- Research and apply to more scholarships ALL year
- October-March: Apply for FAFSA or the CA Dream Act
- Don't take out loans right away. Exhaust other options first

#### Year 1 of College and Beyond

 Repeat the same process that you did in 12th grade.



# College Decision - May 2018




- May 1st
  - Most universities (UCs, CSUs and privates) will ask that you make your decision by May 1st 2018
  - Intent to Register/Enroll Deposit (Deferment available)
- Private Universities
  - Early Decision: decision plans are binding a student who is accepted as an ED attend the college
  - Early Action: plans are nonbinding students receive an early response to thei
    do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1.
  - Approximately 450 colleges have early decision or early action plans, and some have both
